Mission Jamaica Won!

We had a great Zion golf outing on Monday, August 29th. God again blessed our annual golf outing with a beautiful summer day. We had a total of 56 golfers enjoying the day while raising funds in support of our Mission Jamaica partner. The 1st place winners of the golf scramble were a foursome of Cliff & Andy Eng, Rod Erickson, and Andy Tscholl. An interesting note was shared by Cliff Eng of the winning team. Cliff is from Cokato and has lived there for most of his adult life, but he grew up in Buffalo on a family farm. His family farm was the land that our church in now built upon.

The real winner is Mission Jamaica. A total of \$4,645 was raised to help purchase building materials for a small house in Jamaica, which will be built for a family in great need of a better place to call home.

A little background on Mission Jamaica. Mission Jamaica provides various types of onsite support in many ways. Basic health exams and care is provided to the Jamaican people by teams of U.S. doctors, nurses, and laypeople that travel to Jamaica at their own expense and set up day clinics to examine and treat individuals in need of medical attention. Some volunteers can provide various types of help and support at an orphanage, while others provide labor to build one-room homes for Jamaicans who require this type of support. Through Mission Jamaica's guidance churches around the country are encouraged to put together teams of individuals that travel to Jamaica to support these various ministries. Over the years Zion Lutheran has sent many of these teams to Jamaica. We are looking forward to sending more teams in the future.

Through our Zion Global Mission committee, we provide support to three primary mission partners: Mission Jamaica, All Kids Can Learn International, & Redeemer Lutheran Church. Each year the committee identifies a special need for one or more of the mission partners that the golf outing will support. Through the generous support of the golfers and the sponsors that help us with costs, we can provide financial support for our partners. God has truly provided us all with so much as we are all blessed to live in such a prosperous area. He calls us to share our gifts with others. Support of our mission partners is a wonderful blessing to us from God. Thank you.







Seeking Leadership Candidates

The Nominating Committee is accepting nominations for the following positions, to be voted on at the December Annual Meeting. Those interested in serving the congregation in one of these positions, please contact the church office or a member of the Nominating Committee (Susan Davis, Vicky Kath, Jenny Paripovich, Terry Peterson, or Kathy Swanson).

Congregational Council Member

The twelve elected members of the Congregational Council meet monthly. The functions of the council are to lead the congregation in its mission and its long-range planning, listen to the congregation and review committee activities, provide overall direction and guidance for the congregation, monitor the church's financial well being, discuss and act on major initiatives to ensure the overall well-being of the congregation.

Council members serve a three-year term. Each member of the council serves as a liaison to a standing committee and is responsible for keeping the council abreast of their committee's activities. Council members rotate Sunday morning duties which include baptismal support and communion duties. Council members are encouraged to listen to the church members' comments and feedback and to share them at council meetings.

Nominating Committee Member

The Nominating Committee's main function is to seek out qualified candidates to present to the congregation at the annual meeting. The committee is to have at least six members. Members of this committee are elected at the congregational annual meeting to a one-year term. The committee typically meets 3-6 times throughout the year. They determine the characteristics of good candidates, seek congregational input and nominees, and recruit candidates for the church council, the foundation committee, the Synod Assembly, and the Nominating Committee.

Foundation Committee Member

The six-member Foundation Committee meets quarterly and is responsible to the distribution of the proceeds of the foundation funds. Committee members will coordinate the reception of requests for the funds available, discuss all the requests and determine the distribution of those funds within the legal requirements of the foundation. Two members are elected annually to three-year terms.

Synod Assembly Voting Member

The elected Synod Assembly Voting Members will attend and represent our congregation at the annual Minneapolis Area Synod (MAS) Assembly meeting held annually. Typically it is a two-day assembly held in the spring where all MAS voting representatives will discuss and vote on various issues that are important to our synod. The number of voting members we can send may vary. Voting members to the Synod Assembly are elected to two-year terms.

Call Committee Update

The Call Committee met with the Transition Team to learn more about the results of the CAT (Congregational Assessment Tool). The conversation was lively and filled with excitement for the future at Zion. Thank you, again to over 400 of you who participated in the CAT assessment. There is much to glean from what you told us through this tool and the Call Committee will use the feedback to guide and direct the search for Zion's next Senior Pastor.

The Call Committee has also met with Pastor John Hulden, Assistant to the Bishop of the Minneapolis Area Synod of the ELCA. Pastor Hulden led the group through the procedure that is followed in the ELCA when a congregation is seeking to call a pastor. The process is clear and used by all ELCA congregations. It begins with the synod office helping the congregation focus their search for candidates that fit with the goals, ministry, and mission of the congregation. Each candidate is a member of the ELCA's roster for ordained ministers, which helps us know that they have the required education, certification, and endorsements to serve in a congregation.

The synod office helps us navigate through the process which means they are with us every step of the way as a valuable resource and partner in this process. Once the Call Committee has compiled our paperwork, which introduces potential candidates to our hopes, goals, mission, and ministry, the bishop will begin helping us match with pastoral candidates for interviews.

Pastor Hulden stressed the importance of confidentiality throughout the process. Not because there are any secrets, but to respect that some candidates may currently be serving in a congregation and it can be disruptive for a congregation to learn their pastor is interviewing. It is also important for the Call Committee to center their work in prayer and give themselves the time and space they need to discern God's will for this next chapter.

The congregation will continue to be kept well informed as to what phase of the call process we are in. For example, you may see an update that our paperwork has been submitted, that we are interviewing candidates, or that a final candidate has been named. In other words, the details are kept confidential, but not the process.

We will all celebrate at the end of the process when the Call Committee can announce to the council that they have a final candidate! From there, we will gather as a congregation and learn the name of that final candidate and then we pray, discern, and eventually hold a vote to decide if we are calling that final candidate or if we will continue to interview other candidates. There is no way of knowing exactly how long the process will take because there are so many variables involved. Even so, we can know for certain that God is in the midst of it all.

A Steadfast Anchor

Since we live in the land of 10,000+ lakes, it seems fitting to use the early church imagery of an anchor as we draw ourselves to the truth that we have a hope that is sure and certain. Jesus is our anchor in every storm and in the still waters as well. We are in the middle of a sermon series called: "Strength for Today and Hope for Tomorrow." The last few years have challenged all of us in unsettling ways. Doesn't it feel like we are all longing for strength and hope?

In the Bible, an anchor is used as a symbol of our hope in Jesus which gives us stability and

steadfastness in life. In ancient days, the anchor was used in artwork and engravings as a symbol of Christianity. Anchors appear in the Roman catacombs on the tombs of Christians, showing that Jesus Christ is our hope in this world and the next.

In Christ, there is strength and there is hope. This hope is not simply wishful thinking. It is a confident expectation of an absolute certainty: Jesus is your anchor for all that life brings. This hope is sure, steadfast, and secure.

Hebrews is often called a letter, but in recent years, scholars have argued that it is more likely that it was a sermon. That would be a 13-chapter sermon; a bit longer than we are accustomed to! The first people who heard it were a group of Christians who were not eyewitnesses to Jesus' time on earth. In their early years, they were a community that was strong in their commitment to the gospel and to each other. However, as time moved on, their strong and bold faith began to drift.

The words of this early sermon are grounded in a wide-sweeping remembrance of God's goodness and grace. They are words that your best friend might share with you, words filled with honesty and encouragement. They are words to remind you that when your boat seems small or like it is in danger of capsizing, Jesus Christ is with you, unchangeable, unmoving, steadfast, and sure. An anchor for your soul.

And, it is here at Zion, that we are reminded of the truth of that promise. We gather together all throughout the week to experience faith with one another, to serve others, and to be anchored by Christ in a world that tosses us around. Zion is a place that shares Christ's word, strengthens faith, and serves those in need. By doing so together we hold fast to the hope that is ours in Christ Jesus, our Lord., and anchor.



Financial Report

The Finance Committee would like to share the following information. For the month of August, total General Fund income was almost \$50,500. Last year we received August income of a little over \$66,500. For the year to date, we have had income of about \$477,500 which is about \$21,000 less than what was received up to this point in 2021.

Our expenses for August 2022 were almost \$57,000 compared to August 2021 expenses of a little over \$55,000. For the year so far our expenses are about \$528,000 which is about \$71,500 more than what we spent at this point



last year and about \$50,500 more than what our 2022 income has been. As we have been saying this year, it is exciting to see almost full staffing and returning programming to Zion.

Building Fund income for the month of August was about \$9,700. This compares to almost \$14,000 given in August of 2021. For the year our Building Fund income is about \$107,500 which is a little over \$3,000 less than our mortgage payments have been. Our monthly mortgage expense is \$13,834.

We expected that these expenses would exceed our income for a while. We look forward to the time when again our income meets our expenses. Thanks to all for your financial support.


